He also brought the Flow Hive in for demonstration, which was a big attraction for many beekeepers in attendance. The event saw nearly 10,000 people drop in throughout the day. While raising awareness about the importance of honey bees and the beekeeping industry in Ontario and Canada, the Credit Union also collected donations to save the bees, with all proceeds being donated to the Ontario Beekeepers'

Association.

After the event, the Credit Union invited board members of the Ontario Beekeepers' Association to their headquarters to present them with a cheque for \$2,000 that had been donated at the event. This year, the event will be held on May 21, 2023 at the John Paul II Cultural Centre in Mississauga.
